I've got well over a dozen wines to highlight today. Plenty of NEW ARRIVALS, some re-stocked favorites too. There are Smart-buys galore, a few bargains too. And of course, there's Affordable Luxury to tempt us all with as well. And just like digging into the presents under the tree, you never know which one to open first! So in no particular order...

#### "Here by Chance" 2023 Paso Robles Cabernet Sauvignon @ \$19.99 per bottle

case price \$239.88 mix/match is okay

This is our second vintage of this relatively new project, based on a vineyard source in Paso Robles and made by a Sonoma-based winery that makes some very popular wines. This is a textbook, fruit-smooth Paso Robles style of Cabernet, easy to drink and easy to share - but has complexity and Cabernet character so it's easy for Cab-lovers to love! This new vintages is comes nicely recommended, at \$25 retail, by Wine Enthusiast magazine who particularly likes the "mahogany, incense and berry aromas" to be found and also by James Suckling too, who notes the "upfront mixed cherries and currants are dusted with cocoa powder and a slightly char-edged, toasted vanilla and singed herb character."

# KIONA 2020 "Estates Cuvee" Red @ \$16.67 per bottle

case price \$200 mix/match is okay

Red Mountain vineyard quality, all-estate grown. This red blend is a "meritage" or "claret" style of red blend from one of the best wineries and vineyard sources in Washington's Columbua Valley. Drinking in a serious - yet very approachable - style. It is perhaps best described by James Suckling in hs recommendation hen he said there is "a high level of varietal diversity in this well-matured, well-mannered and full-bodied blend."

#### FOGSCAPE 2023 Arroyo Seco Chardonnay @ \$19.99 per bottle

case price \$225 mix/match is okay

Rated 90 points (at \$25 retail) by Wine Enthusiast magazine! This is a dry, but richly oaked, classic California Chardonnay. The winery, Arroyo Seco Vineyards, in the central coast also makes the "Montoya" Montery Chard we loved this summer, this one is a ful level up but less than five bucks more

## Peirano Estate 2022 artist series "Illusion" red blend @ \$13.33 per bottle

case price \$159.99 (same as my Fall Sale price, restocked favorite)

Rated 90 points by Wine Enthusiast: "This wine is concentrated, with aromas of red currant compote, dark plum, simmering spices and toasty oak." A blend of old vine Zinfandel, with varying amounts of Cabernet, Merlot, and Petite Sirah. A blend-lovers blend!

## Zardetto doc PROSECCO @ \$14.99 per bottle

case price: \$162 (\$13.50 ea)

a **perennial 90-pointer** by magazines like Wine Enthusiast, Vinous Media, and James Suckling. A crisp and refreshing dry Prosecco in a fun bottle by a well-known producer!

## Domaine Rolet Blanc Brut CREMANT de Jura sparkling @ \$24.99 per bottle

This is a new wine for me, imported by a small local supplier directly to our market, and is already in the running for my favorite "not Champagne" of the season. I will write more about this one in my sparkling wines newsletter in a couple weeks, but fans of French sparkling Brut for reasoanble prices will want to check this out right away. Very classy, and lovely. Mostly Chardonnay in the blend, so very much a "Blanc de Blancs" style Brut (Cremant de Jura)

## GILLOT 2023 PINOT NOIR @ \$19.99 per bottle

case price \$239.88 mix/match is okay

The name sounds French, but it's not a Burgundy. The Pinot Noir tastes like a good \$20 west-coast Pinot Noir, but it's not from Willamette Valley, and it's not from California. The label looks like it's for Easter, not for Christmas. So that's what it's not. What it IS is a very classy and very likeable \$19.99 per bottle smart buy Pinot Noir... from Germany!

# Castle Rock 2021 Monterey Pinot Noir @ \$9.99 per bottle

case price \$107.88 (\$8.99 ea)

Rated 88 points by Wine Enthusiast, and the best Pinot Noir of the three available cuvees of Pinot Noir by this reliable bargain winery. Wine Enthusiast notes: "cherry and toasted wood aromas show on the nose of this bottling. The palate is familiar and reliable with wood, fruit and spice flavors aligning." Perfect for parties!!

# INDABA 2024 Chenin Blanc @ \$7.99 per bottle

\$95.88 per case, mix/match is okay

Recently recommended by Wine Enthusiast magazine, as a \$12 retail, saying "Tropical aromas that include mango and pineapple take over the nose of this white wine. Soft ripe flavors of white fruit are backed by gentle acidity." Chenin Blanc is definitely having it's moment, and this one is the best bargain by far. From South Africa. Perfect for parties!!

# "Bruce Jack" 2021 Pinotage 'reserve collection" @ \$14.99 per bottle

case price: \$179.88

Combine this **Aussie Shiraz styled red** with the Indaba Chenin Blanc and you can have an off the beaten path (South Africa) wine theme to your party. There is no earthy or pipe tobacco in this Pinotage (well, maybe just a tiny bit) but there is tons of blueberry fruit and depth. Aussie Shiraz fans would love this wine, and since those are not around as much anymore - check this out instead! Drinks like \$20 wine, and looks like \$20 wine. From Breedekloof, near Paarl.

(seasonal favorite, limited stock) Georges Dubeouf 2025 Beajolais Nouveau @ \$17.99 per bottle

My last couple of cases of this year's very successful version of the famous Beaujolais Nouveau. As Wine Spectator magazine said: ""Georges Duboeuf's workhorse, the widely available Beaujolais Nouveau bottling, was the highlight of its category, showing violet and blackcurrant jelly aromas and flavors with the vibrant, lifted character that Nouveau fans are looking for."

(seasonal favorite, very limited stock) Lenotti 2017 AMARONE della Valpolicella Classico @ \$55.99 per bottle
Every Christmas I look for a ready-to-drink Amarone for fans who love this with their holiday meals. This year, the one I found has really charmed me. I wish there was more available, but that's par for the course with Amarone. It doesn't help that I'm loving the 2017-vintage we have but the importer has moved onto 2018, and one of the sixpack cases broke in the delivery van too. So I apologize in advance for how limited stock this is. But if you want some bottles of Amarone this season, I highly recommend you get some of this one!! 6pk case price can be mixed/matched for \$53.33 each (\$320 per 6pk)

Last but not least, speaking of limited stock of great wines... I am sorry to report that the Turely Zinfandels in last week's newsletter are all sold out. So is the L.E. "Ancellotta" red by Piattelli. Sorry those were so fleeting... but the GOOD NEWS is that I do still have stock of the 2 wines from Wine Spectator magazine latest "Top 100" edition:
